

Uruguay 30 Day Prayer Guide

Praying for the 4 Presbyterian churches/church plants in the nation

Passionate, committed prayer is what is needed in order to see fruit in the country of Uruguay, the most secular country in all of the Americas. Would you be committed to making an eternal difference by bringing the spiritual needs of Uruguay before our heavenly Father?

- 1. That many would see clearly their lost condition and mourn for their sin
- 2. That the Holy Spirit would draw many into the Kingdom
- 3. Against the sharp rise in crime
- 4. Against the increasing legislation that protects LGBT rights at the expense of religious freedom and protecting children and the family
- 5. For a return to respect and value of marriage and against divorce (divorce rate: 70%)
- 6. That the many incoming immigrants from nations such as Cuba and Venezuela would turn to Christ and that they then would lead many Uruguayans to the Savior
- 7. That the gods of comfort, pleasure and soccer that many serve would be shown to be false gods
- 8. For more church plants to begin
- 9. That a Presbyterian denomination would form, and that it would be solid doctrinally, unified and marked by spiritual maturity
- 10. For strong elder and deacon candidates that would lead to churches governed by nationals
- 11. That key doctrines that may seem foreign to believers here—especially the doctrines of grace, infant baptism and the importance of the church—would be fully understood and embraced by members and attendees
- 12. The hearts of the church members would be knit together in unity and love for one another and that the leadership would have wisdom in cultivating this
- 13. For the addition of some stable families who are seeking a Bible teaching church that would in turn help strengthen the church communities
- 14. That God would bless the mercy ministries during the time of COVID-19 to spread the love of Jesus and bring in the lost

- 15. That God would protect the pastors, missionaries, elders and deacons from the world, the flesh and the devil and keep them refreshed and renewed in their labor
- 16. That the church leadership would be dedicated to spending serious time each week in prayer and that church prayer meetings would be well attended and include passionate and faith-filled intercession
- 17. For physical health for the church leadership and members, especially for healing and mercy on some members who have cancer
- 18. Thank God for the start of a Presbyterian seminary in 2019 and pray that God would strengthen and grow its ministry to raise up leadership for evangelical churches all over the country
- 19. That the seminary would have more teachers, and for strength for both teachers and students to add the responsibilities of classes to already full schedules
- 20. That covenant children in the schools would be protected by false ideologies and worldliness and would be a strong light and witness to their peers
- 21. For strong families, informed by the Bible
- 22. Strong discipleship within the family and within the church
- 23. Deeper understanding of the importance of the Lord's Day worship and willingness to submit to healthy leadership
- 24. That children of believers would follow Jesus
- 25. Churches would be Bible-centered, with healthy doctrine
- 26. Bold witness and willingness to suffer for the name of Jesus
- 27. Growth of interest in the Doctrines of Grace, that those who are caught up in prosperity teaching or legalism would be discipled in the Biblical faith
- 28. For economic provision for church families
- 29. That God would bless Christian families with an abundance of children and the spiritual and economic resources with which to raise them
- 30. For the missionary families from Brazil and the U.S. (Rolim and Richline families), that they would be effective in their cross-cultural work and that God would protect they and their families as they are far from home.
